Preface

In Melbourne in June 1997, Peter Paul Portelli formed a group of people dedicated to helping the sick and needy. He named it after the patron saints of his former parish of St Peter and St Paul in Nadur, Gożo. Over the past twenty years the group has grown from humble beginnings in the West of Melbourne, to having Chapters in Australia, America, Canada, Africa, and Europe. The Confraternity members, or confreres, do not seek titles, albeit the Confraternity is organised around levels of membership. Similarly, it is a not for profit organisation, and does not raise funds for itself and every dollar raised passes entirely to charitable causes.

Twenty years have passed quickly and Peter Paul Portelli, with the support and encouragement of the Supreme Council of the Confraternity, brought about this gathering of confreres in Malta. Described as a convention, it occurs historically in the month of June 2017 marking the twentieth anniversary of the Confraternity. It coincides with other anniversaries in June 2017 such as the 150th anniversary of the parish of St Peter & St Paul at Nadur, Gożo, Malta. Peter Paul Portelli assisted by his Personal Secretary in the Confraternity, Joseph John Coleiro, has been eager to record the history of the Confraternity for the past twenty years. This had the full support of the

Confraternity's management body, the Supreme Council, based in Melbourne Australia.

We make this Prayer through Christ our Lord.



It exhibits a black Maltese Cross and a shield with the symbols of Saint Peter – the keys, and Saint Paul – the sword and serpent.



The Crest

This design of the crest was by Luis Soveral Varella.

The Maltese Cross reflects the Maltese heritage of the Confraternity. Its eight points represent the eight beatitudes. The black for the Maltese cross reflects the colour of the original Malta Cross, the Cross of Amalfi, being black.

The centre medallion the symbols of Saint Peter – the keys, and Saint Paul – the sword and serpent.

Chevalier Fr. Manuel Sunaz CMF



Fr Manuel Suñaz CMF is a member of Claretian Missionaries, a religious congregation officially known as Missionaries Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

With two other Claretian priests he came to Australia in 2009 and was assigned as Parish Priest in St Peter Chanel Parish, Deer Park, Victoria. In 2014, he accepted the invitation of the Grand Master of the Confraternity of the Knights SS Peter and Paul to be the Melbourne Chaplain of the Confraternity.

Fr Manuel Suñaz CMF was born and raised in the Philippines and joining the seminary at 13 years of age.

After finishing his Bachelor in Psychology he proceeded to Philosophy and Theology in the University of Santo Thomas, Manila. In 1983 he was ordained in his home town of Zamboanga City. He spent his first two years working as a Spiritual Director at the Claretian School in the same town and as parish youth organizer. Later he was assigned to Metro Manila as a Parish Priest of the Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish at the University of the Philippines Village, Quezon City.

Fr Manuel Suñaz CMF volunteered to go to Africa but was instead sent to join the new Claretian mission in South Korea, later moving Japan. In 1990, he was sent to East Timor with two other Claretians to start a new mission in the mountainous area of the frontier with West Timor. The Lord blessed them with many vocations, and now the local Claretian Missionaries are continuing responsibilities in the mission.

Fr Manuel Suñaz CMF returned to the Philippines and took up works as Rector of seminary, School director, Parish Priest and was sent to Vietnam for three years to join two other Claretians in the new mission in the south.

Like Timor the Vietnam mission flourished with the blessings of the Lord. The young vocations that came not long ago are now ordained and are the ones responsible in running the place. From the human and spiritual perspective it is so fulfilling and consoling to experience the Lord working through those who are willing to be his disciples.

Grand Chapter of Portugal

Chevalier Fr. Antonio Manuel Martins



Fr. Antonio Manuel Martins was born in 1955 in São João da Pesqueira, Portugal, which located in Alto Douro where port wine is produced.

Fr. Martins is a Vincentian missionary ordained in Porto, Portugal, on July 27, 1980. He has worked as a missionary in Alentejo, Beira Alta, Trás-os-Montes and now in a parish in Oporto. His experience of pastoral life has been enriched by the variety of towns and little villages across the country.

Fr. Martins professes that to proclaim Jesus Christ in the joy of the Gospel and to live according to the charism of St. Vincent de Paul is his life and ministry.

Seat of the Confraternity and the Supreme Council

The Seat of the Confraternity is located in Melbourne, Victoria. Australia.

Melbourne is where the Confraternity was created in June 1997 and is metropolis where the Supreme Council is located; and where the Supreme Council Members meet. It is also where the Grand Master HE Chevalier Peter Paul Portelli resides.

The Aims of the Confraternity

The Confraternity is a Roman Catholic philanthropic association of men and women who are designated as Knights and Dames respectively. Their goal is to raise funds and assist the poor and needy, such as church communities in persecuted areas. The aims in its Constitution are:

- 1. To operate as a charitable institution.
- 2. To bring people of all nations to pray and socialize together.
- 3. To commemorate the feast of St. Peter and St. Paul.
- 4. To appoint knights and dames on commemoration day.
- 5. To encourage the younger generations to continue with our traditions and cultures.
- 6. To honour members of the Catholic faith for their tireless benevolent work in the community.
- 7. The primary purpose of the Knights and Dames is to serve God and His people.
- 8. The Confraternity places itself under the protection of the Virgin Mary Queen and Mother and the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul.

Rules of the Confraternity

The Confraternity as an incorporated association has a set of rules called a Constitution. This is registered in the State of Victoria and sets out the body's legal personality in compliance with the requirements for such bodies under Victorian and Australian laws.

In addition, there are rules governing the members. In essence, a membership is open to members of the Catholic community who prove to be humble, honest and caring leaders of the community, and who are nominated for membership. If successful, such persons may be admitted to the Confraternity on his/her merits.

Membership rules include that:

- 1. Members of the community who work tireless to serve other people in arts, music, religion, social, cultural and welfare may be eligible to be admitted to the Confraternity.
- 2. A person can only be admitted to the Confraternity, if nominated by a knight, a dame or a prior.
- 3. The Supreme Council of the Confraternity will carefully consider all nominations.
- 4. The Confraternity shall have no financial obligations or joining fees on its knights and dames.

- 5. A person who is nominated to the Confraternity, will be required to submit a brief history of his/her community work.
- 6. People who seek personal honours and glory will not be admitted to the Confraternity.
- 7. The knight and dames will have an obligation to attend the annual celebrations.
- 8. The Confraternity of St. Peter and St. Paul has no affiliations with any other Order.
- 9. Knights can use the post-nominal KSPP; Dames can use the post-nominal DSPP.

The Vow for the Knights and Dames

At investiture, all Knights and Dames take a vow of service to charity:

Upon the true faith of a Christian,

may God witness that I hereby Vow to dedicate myself as a servant to Him and His people.

As a Knight / Dame,

I promise to imitate St. Peter and St. Paul in the true Christian values:

to be Honest, Humble and Caring Leader of the community.

I therefore ask God

to send upon me the blessing of the Holy Spirit,

to give me wisdom and strength to serve Him and His people.

In the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

So help me God. Amen.

Grand Master and Founder of the Confraternity



H.E. Peter Paul Portelli Grandmaster

Peter Paul Portelli was born in Nadur, Gożo, Malta on the 26 September, 1952. His father was Coronatu Portelli, son of Paul Portelli and grandson of Gamm Maria Portelli. H.E.

Portelli's mother was Margaret née Falzon daughter of Marija and Mikiel Falzon, ancestor of Majsi Falzon who lived in Gożo after the 1565 Great Siege of Malta.

The Maltese local family name is "tas-Sultan". The family lived in Ramla Road, Nadur, Gożo. Peter entered the elementary school of Nadur at six years of age. At the age seven, and every year thereafter, he was selected as prefect of his class or as a class spokes-person.

At the age of fourteen years, H.E. Peter Portelli was already a community leader, involved in music, dancing, singing and football in his home town of Nadur. He was a member of the Mnarja Philharmonic Society, was a member of the local dance group, sang in the local choir and solo and coached the Catholic Action soccer team.

At 19 years of age, Peter emigrated to Australia where he settled in Melbourne, in the State of Victoria. As soon as he arrived in Australia he formed a soccer team at the work place. That went on for a number of years.

In 1979 H.E. formed the Australian Nadur Association to organize the feast of Sts Peter and Paul and became its first president. He ordered the statue of St. Peter and St. Paul that was made in Nadur, Gożo by Michael Camilleri Cauchi, now a Chevalier with the Confraternity of the Knights of St. Peter & St. Paul.

Bishop Nikol Cauchi blessed the statue of St. Peter and St. Paul before it was sent to Australia in 1981.

The statue arrived five days after the feast of Sts Peter and Paul celebration of 1981 and was used for the first time for that feast in June, 1982. This coincided with 100th anniversary of the inauguration of that the original statue of Sts Peter and Paul located in the Basilica of Nadur.

Peter Paul Portelli and Local Council Elections

In 1986, Peter Paul Portelli as elected Councilor of the City of Sunshine. During his term in office of Councilor, the council named a street after Peter's home town of Nadur, Gożo. The street is "Nadur Court" in St Albans, a suburb of the City of Sunshine.

In 1987 the council

of the City of Sunshine chose Nadur, Gożo, as its Sister City. On New Years Eve of 1987 during Monsignor Archpriest Sam Muscat visit to Melbourne, the Mayor of the City of Sunshine Cr. Gerry O'Connor officially invited him at the Town Hall together with Cr. Portelli and Mr. Gużi Muscat from Nadur.

In 1988 Councillor Portelli represented the City of Sunshine at the tri-centennial celebrations of the parish of Nadur.

Councillor Portelli presented the flag of the City of Sunshine to the Mnarja Philharmonic Society. He also presented a flag to the Mnarja Philharmonic Society that was paid for by the Nadurin living in Melbourne, Australia.

Peter Paul Portelli's work as Founder of Associations

In 1991, H.E. founded the Maltese Cultural Association Inc. In 1992 he acquired an old railways building and established the Maltese Cultural Centre, in Albion. T

he Hon. Ian Baker State Member for Sunshine officially opened the Maltese Cultural Centre and was blessed by the Rector of Ta' Pinu Sanctuary in Gożo, Malta, Mons. Benedict Camilleri on the 23 December, 1993.

Vincenzo Galtieri (Vince) was born on 6 January, 1943, in the town of Bruzzano Zaffirio, in Reggio Calanria, Italy. Vince is the oldest of four siblings. José Manuel Martins Ferreira Coelho, was born in Lisbon on May 7, 1943.

He attended the Queen Elizabeth's School from 1947 to 1953, followed by the Normal High School of Pedro Nunes from 1953 to 1960.

He graduated in Medicine from the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Lisbon in 1967 and obtained his doctorate from the same University in 1999. Chev Coelho held such roles as officer of the Portuguese Navy, Naval Reserve (13th CFORN) from 1968 to 1971; Chief of Health Service, Company No. 1 of Marines and Head of Health Service of the Lake Niassa Circumscription; Delegate of Health of the Circumscription of Lake Niassa from 1969 to 1970; and lecturer in the FML Human Anatomy Chair at the University of Lisbon from 1972 to 1984.

Chev Coelho completed his career in medicine as General Surgery and Urology of the Civil Hospitals of Lisbon, as specialist in both areas and Head of General Surgery.

He is a member of the College of Specialties of General Surgery and Urology, of the Order of Physicians; of several National and International Medical Societies; Fellow of the prestigious College of American Surgeons and a member of the International Advisory Board of the Society of (USA), Laparoscopic Surgeons and other various internationally renowned societies. Apart form being appointed by the Grand Master as the Confraternity's Deputy Grand Master for Europe, Chev Coelho is also a Knight of Justice of the Hospitaller Order of St. Lazarus of Jerusalem.

Chev Coelho is also the author of several written papers and scientific videos in the field of medicine, and various books on other subjects.

Creation of the Confraternity of the Knights of St. Peter & St. Paul

In November 1996, H.E. Peter Paul Portelli formed the Confraternity of the Knights St Peter & St Paul to honor members of the Catholic faith for their tireless work in the community. Originally, it was called the Order of St. Peter and Paul. The name Confraternity of the Knights of St. Peter & St. Paul was changed in 2009 to comply with a request from the Catholic Church.

The first chapter and seat of the Supreme Council is in Melbourne. In 2000, the chapters of Western Australia and Malta were added.

The first investiture took place at St. Bernadette's parish church in North Sunshine in 1997.

Over time, to 2017, other chapters, in Australia were added - Sydney - Canberra - South Australia, and in other countries - Austria - Germany - Canada (Toronto, Cambridge, British Columbia) - Italy (Bari, Sicily) - Spain - Portugal - Croatia - Angola - Cameroon - Peru - Argentina - Russia.

History

Papal Order of the Knights of St Peter in the Papal States 1521

In 1521, the Pope Leo X by a Papal Bull, established The Order of the Knights of St Peter.

The Order was made up of 401 men chosen from among the best and most faithful collaborators of the Pope and of the Church.

The Order was given the task of managing the administrative affairs of the Apostolic Camera, and to ensure the presence of a body of knights to defend the safety of the person of the Pope and of the same hospitals used on various sectors by necessity of war.

Pope Leo X instigated in 1521 a Collegium of 42 officials under the title of the *Equestrian Order of St. Peter* as a precautionary measure that works of Tulfa (Forum Clodii) would not be supplied to the Turks, and with the income of these works deception would be carried out. Members were appointed to this Order; appointed members were 'Participantes' and the Order took from every member 1000 gold florins as an entrance fee, of which 5 percent were given to the members as annual income.

Every knight was taken with his eldest son into the higher nobility and into the number of Palatines from the Lateran. Later, Pope Paul V detracted some other privileges hitherto granted to the Order.

Knights had to wear black on the day of death of a Pope and red at every coronation. As a religious symbol a gold medal on a gold chain was worn on the Knight's chest, on one side with an image of St. Peter and on the other side the Papal coat of arms. The Order was later attached to the possession of some Chancellery posts, and continues to exist today by its name.

Pope Clement VII, the successor of Pope Leo X in 1522, was born Giulio de 'Medici. As Pope, he confirmed this Order with a further Papal Bull issued in October of 1526. This was published at the Chancery of the Pontifical on January 3, 1527.

In the mid sixteenth century, Pope Paul III reaffirmed the Order of the Knights of St. Peter (Papal Bull of 26 February 1534, published in the Papal Chancellery on 20 December 1535) with the same forms, methods and content produced by Pope Leo X.

He wanted to not duplicate such an order by creating another, and so created a Board under the name of the College, known as the Knights of St. Paul. This was by a Papal Bull of 25 June 1540, which saw the publication in the Papal Chancellery July 19, 1541. This new Order was composed of 200 Knights. It was confirmed by Pope Julius III on March 21, 1549. The driving thought was to help the then impoverished household of the Papal State. For a sum of 200,000 Scudi, this 'Knight Club' called St. Pauli was set up for, as noted, 200 members. They received such benefits as:

- to be "Participantes" and "Perpetui Commensales" and had the right to obtain, in the palace of the Lateran, a daily free meal.
- to be included with the noble families,
- allowed to decorate their coat of arms with the "Lily of the Farnese" coat of arms.

• receive a pension of year 200 Scudi from the Church.

At the coronation day of a pope they had to appear in the red suit with a bare arm with naked sword on the left breast as a religious sign. On funeral day of the Pope they had to mourn in black.

For a long time, these two separate Orders were completely equalized by Pope Paul III by having them as Boards or Chapters of the one College. It allowed the Knights to decide to belong either to one or the other Order, yet, although equalized, the two Orders were never merged. Each maintained its own identity.

In addition to being Knights of these two aforesaid Orders leading to each member being declared "Diners" and "Family of the Pope", members were at the same time, Knights of the Golden Militia, as well as members of the House Lateran, and thus ascribed to the highest degree of Pontifical Nobility.

The two Orders received further confirmation in 1561 by Pope Pius IV. However, by the late sixteenth century, they lost their vitality.

In summary it is certain that when in 1520 Pope Leo X established the Knights of St. Peter, he intended to create a

College of trusted men, clergymen and at the same time they had the dual task of lifting the Apostolic Chamber administrative burdens, constitute a 'wide assembly of expert advisors, ready to provide its expertise to the discussions within the State. Pope Paul III at the time of the creation of the Knights of St. Paul, wanted to strengthen that Order set up by Pope Leo X, and introduce the new Order with the appearance of a Chivalric Army Military Company that the first Order lacked. Such a character meant members could not contravene a Papal command, whether in sessions of the Council or in bearing arms as in holy wars, according to the needs of the moment.

The 'new' Order of the Knights of St. Peter and St. Paul 1997

The then President of the Nadur Association in Victoria, Australia, Mr Peter Paul Portelli, later appointed Grandmaster of the new Order, was the founder of the then so-named Order of St. Peter & St. Paul.

1997 - Year 1

The then so-named Order of St. Peter and St. Paul was established in the Roman Catholic parish of St. Bernadette in North Sunshine, Melbourne, Australia, under the banner of the Australian Nadur Association who was the organizer of the feast of St. Peter and St. Paul. The first ceremonial investiture ceremony was held on Sunday, 6th July 1997, during a Mass in honour of the Apostles Saints Peter and Paul.

The mass commenced at 2.00 p.m. It was a High Mass, for the Solemnity of the two apostles Saints Peter and Paul. After the panegyric, Mr Peter Paul Portelli, Founder and head of the Order read a message from the Honourable Jeff Kennett MP, the then Premier of Victoria on behalf of the Victorian Government and a message from the Most Rev. Mgr. Sam Muscat, Archpriest of the Basilica of St. Peter and Paul of Nadur in Gozo, Malta.

Mr. Portelli then presented the first members and made a testimonial about the aims and objectives of the new Order. Mr. Portelli said that there was a need to recognize the tireless voluntary work that many people do in the community, dedicating many long hours, day after day. As part of his address to the inaugural members, Mr. Portelli said:

"Today we are honouring two great Christian leaders followers of Christ, St. Peter and Paul, so it is appropriate that we are recognizing these living community leaders here today. These living leaders will today take a vow that they will continue to serve God and His people and to imitate St. Peter and Paul in their Christian values."

This historic event wouldn't have been achieved without the support of the Parish Priest, Fr. John Taliana MSSP. There was opposition, such as a person called Fr. John who, on the telephone, tried to persuade the parish priest to not let the first ceremony take place in the parish; Fr. John ignored the caller. Opposition to, and persecution of, Christianity was a feature of the Church's developmental history especially in

its early years, and from those energies, it grew, as has the Confraternity.

Fr. John Taliana MSSP. Parish Priest of St. Bernadette read the vow and the candidates repeated after him. Fr. John Taliana blessed the first members with the Holy Water. The Head of the Order Mr. Peter Paul Portelli placed the medal on the members while the Mayor of the City of Brimbank, Cr. Ciro Lombardi placed the mantle on the shoulder of the members.

Chev Bruno Rabensteiner became Deputy Head of the Order.

After the Mass the inaugural members of the then new Order, now Confraternity, took part in the procession of which was led by the statue of St. Peter and St. Paul, and accompanied by the Maltese Own Band, and representatives of the Maltese Associations. This was followed by refreshments in the church hall.

Sunday, 12 July, 1998 was the second investiture for the new Order. The investiture ceremony took place during a mass celebrated in honour of St. Peter and St. Paul at St. Bernadette Church, in Westmoreland Road in North Sunshine. The Mass commenced at 2.30 p.m. After the panegyric, Bruno Rabensteiner Deputy Head of the Order read a testimonial on the aims and values of the Order.

New members were Peter Paul Portelli (the Founder), Suzi Fanjek, Ivan Skratulja, Fred Wolske, Leonard Harkin, Tomasso Diele, George Saliba, Norma Angelini, David Connolly and Victor Aquilina. Fr. Karm Borg MSSP, a member of the Order guided the new members through the Solemn Vow. The deputy Head of the Order placed the medal on the new members while Cr. Sam David, Mayor of Brimbank, placed the mantle on their shoulder

The Founder of the Order, a former Consul of the Sovereign Order of St. John of Jerusalem, Peter Paul Portelli took the vow of a Knight and Grand Prior.

Afterwards a procession with the statue of St. Peter and Paul took place accompanied by the Maltese Own Band from the Maltese Own Band Philharmonic Society Incorporated, with representatives of Maltese and Gożitan Associations with their banners, the Mayor of Brimbank dressed in his mayoral robes, and members of the Order.

This was the third investiture – Sunday 3 July 1999. This year the feast of St. Peter and St. Paul was held in the parish hall of St. Bernadette while the church was being renovated.

The Mass began at 2.30 p.m. The new members where: Josip Petruzalek, Dieter Bajzek, Bernard O'Connor, Alfred Asciak, Bruno Klepp and Reno Ċini.

Fr. Alfred Farrugia MSSP delivered a nice panegyric. Fr. Victor Bonello was the prime celebrant and guided the new members through the vow.

Cr. Sam David representing the City of Brimbank placed the mantle on the shoulder of the new members while Chev Bruno Rabensteiner placed the medals on them.

After the Mass a procession was held around the neighbourhood with the statue of St. Peter and St. Paul, accompanied by the Maltese Own Band Philharmonic Society Incorporated, together with members of the Order and representatives of Maltese Association.

2000 - First Council of the Order



The Investiture for 2000 took place on Sunday 18 June. The feast was held earlier than usual so members of the committee could go to Malta for the celebrations in Nadur, Gożo. The venue also was changed because the statue of St. Peter and Paul was now placed in the parish centre in Cooke Ave, Sunshine.

In this year the Mass began at 2.00 p.m. After the panegyric, the ceremony of the investiture took place. Peter Paul Portelli, Grand Prior of the Order said a few words about what was expected from the candidates of the Order.

After the Mass the procession with the statue of St. Peter and St. Paul was held around the car park accompanied by the Maltese Own Band Philharmonic Society Incorporated, and members of the Order, the Mayor of Brimbank dressed in the mayoral robes, plus representatives of the Maltese association and the Croatian community.

2000 - New Priory in Malta

In the year 2000, the Order of St. Peter & St. Paul opened its first Priory outside Melbourne, Australia. The new priory was established in the town of Nadur, Gożo, Malta under the patronage of the Nadur Local Council. The investiture ceremony took place in the Basilica of St. Peter & St. Paul in the parish of Nadur. The mass commenced at 7.00 pm. in a day that was dedicated to the migrants.

The prime celebrant was Mgr. Sam Muscat Archpriest of Nadur, assisted by a large number of priests. After the panegyric, the Grand Prior who was visiting the islands, made a short speech on the aims of the Order and the need to honour local members for their dedications and tireless work in their locality.

The Grand Prior then called the first candidates to the new priory on the Maltese Islands to take their vow: Dr. Chris Said - Mayor, Mgr. Salv Pace, Can. Carmel Portelli, Joseph Żerafa, Peter Paul Camilleri, Andrew Muscat, and Joe Curmi.

On Friday 28 June three members of the Order took part in the procession of "Translazzjoni" around St. Peter and Paul's Square before the service in the Basilica.

2000 - New Priory in Western Australia

The Order's Council in Melbourne nominated Reno Aquilina, a Maltese community activist in WA to the Order. Mr

Aquilina accepted the nomination and was elected Deputy Prior to assist Prior Bruno Rabensteiner.

2001 - Blessing of Cardinal A. Stepinac

On Saturday 10 February 2001, the Confraternity had been invited to, and attended the celebration at St. Patrick's Cathedral in Melbourne for the blessing of Cardinal Stepinac.

A solemn Mass was celebrated by Archbishop George Pell (now Cardinal Pell), assisted by some Croatian priests. The members took part in the procession from the sacristy to the Cathedral.

After the Mass, a bust of Cardinal Stepinac was unveiled outside the Cathedral. Afterwards the members attended dinner at the Croatian Centre in Clifton Hill.

A number of members attended this solemn occasion and were robed. They were warmly welcomed by the community, at this historic occasion.

2007 - Year 11

2007 - Independent body

This period saw the Confraternity becoming independent. The Order of St. Peter and St. Paul became registered under the Association Incorporations Act as an incorporated association, with its own corporate identity, under the laws in the State of Victoria, Australia. This body is recognized nationally as an incorporated body, incorporated in Victoria, and it is regulated by Consumer Affairs in the State of Victoria; its name became Order of St. Peter and St. Paul Incorporated.



The Archdiocese of Melbourne suggested that the name should be changed to Confraternity. The Supreme Council of the Order agreed and a change was made in 2009.







2014 – Pilgrimage to Portugal


On Tuesday 29 July 2014, Grand Master Peter Paul Portelli represented the Confraternity in a Pilgrimage to Portugal Portugal, which linked Australia and Europe in the common humanitarian goals and moral principles embraced by the Confraternity of the Knights of St. Peter and St. Paul, a Confraternity with its World Headquarters in the City of Melbourne, Australia.

The visit included a ceremony of great dignity at the Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima, to grant the Insignia to the Portuguese Knights and Dames of the Confraternity. The ceremony was reported on by Cav. Dr. Pedro Laranjeira, Secretary/ Public Relations.

The Chapel of Apparitions, a place usually reserved for high dignitaries, bishops and popes, where the Grand Master and the Portuguese Knights took part in the celebration.

The Confraternity's Grand Master and his wife were initially received with a lunch in Lisbon Geographical Society, organized by the Group of Côrte-Real Studies, followed by a Solemn Session in English in the noble space of "Sala Portugal".

After a warm welcome by President Luís Aires-Barros, the Pilgrims heard lectures by various delegates.

The speakers were Deputy Grand Master of the Confraternity, Professor Doctor José Ferreira Coelho, Eng. António Mattos e Silva, Architect Luis Soveral Varella and Vice Admiral Alexandre da Fonseca, Director of the Navy Magazine. Prior to the message by H.E. the Grand Master, Peter Paul Portelli, Pedro Laranjeira spoke on the history of the discovery of Australia by the Portuguese Navigator Cristóvão de Mendonça in 1522, a century before the arrival of the first Dutch and 248 years before Captain James Cook RN.

Gifts were exchanged and the Foundation Luciano da Silva offered the visitors some relics and important documents on the History of Portugal, from the Museum in Cavião. Chev. José Ferreira Coelho guided the visitors on a tour of some of the most emblematic monuments where Lisbon illustrates the many centuries of Portugal's history. The following day, the pilgrims travelled to pay devotion to the Mother of Christ where her apparitions in 1917 took place, in a rural countryside called Cova da Iria. The Knights and Dames of St. Peter and St. Paul where honoured with a highly dignified ceremony and the celebration of a dedicated Eucharist, in the inner circle of the Chapel of Apparitions, a place usually reserved for high dignitaries, bishops and popes, where the Grand Master and the Portuguese Knights and Dames took part in the celebration.

For nearly one hour and before thousands of devotees, the Chapel received this new generation of Lusitania Paladins, in a special Mass celebrated by Rev. António Martins, himself a Knight of the Confraternity. Medals and Certificates were blessed for the appointing of the eight Portuguese Knights distinguished by the Confraternity.

After the celebration, Chev. Professor Doctor José Ferreira Coelho was invested as Knight and in the position of Deputy Grand Master, and Chev. Pedro Laranjeira as Knight and as Secretary of the Priory of Portugal and Public Relations Officer of the Confraternity.

2015 - New Chapters of the Philippines and Belarus


At its meeting of Thursday, 17 May 2015, the Supreme Council approved two new Chapters - the Philippines and Belarus
